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GUILTY PLEA COLLOQUY

You are appearing before this Court because you and/or your attorney have stated that you wish to plead guilty to some or all of the criminal offenses with which you have been charged. Please answer fully all of the questions on this document. Most of the questions are designed to be answered "Yes" or "No". However, where general information is requested, please answer fully. If you do not understand any question asked of you, you should leave it blank, and you should also inform your attorney so that they can explain it to you fully. After you have finished reading this and have filled it out, initial each page at the bottom and sign it on the last page on the line above "Defendant", but only if you have read it and fully understand it.

12. Do you understand that the right to trial by a jury means that a jury would be randomly selected from the voter registration list of Beaver County and a cross-section of the citizens of Beaver County? _____
13. Do you understand that you would be able to participate, with your attorney, in the selection of a jury? _____
14. Do you understand that the jury has to agree unanimously on your guilt before you can be convicted of the crime(s) with which you are charged? _____
15. You are presumed innocent until found guilty. Do you understand that at a trial, the Commonwealth must prove your guilt beyond a reasonable doubt before you can be convicted of the crime(s) charged? _____
16. Do you understand that at a trial, the Commonwealth has the burden of proof, which means that you can remain silent and nothing can be held against you for choosing not to testify in your own defense? _____
17. Do you understand that at a trial, you have a right to confront and cross-examine all Commonwealth witnesses in your case who are necessary to prove your guilt and that by pleading guilty, you are waiving that right of confrontation and cross-examination? _____
18. Do you understand that if you were convicted after a trial, you could appeal the verdict to a higher court, raising any errors that were committed in the trial court, and that this could result in your being awarded a new trial or dismissal of the charge(s)? _____
19. Do you understand that you could challenge whether or not the Commonwealth had presented enough evidence at a trial to prove you guilty beyond a reasonable doubt? _____
20. Do you understand that by pleading guilty, you are giving up your right to trial by a jury and those rights related to that trial? _____
21. Do you understand that by pleading guilty, you are giving up your right to present any pre-trial motions for consideration to this or a higher court in the event those motions were denied? _____
22. Are you aware that the Court is not bound by the terms of any plea agreement entered into between you, your attorney and the attorney for the Commonwealth, until the Court accepts such plea agreement? _____
23. If you enter a guilty plea and it is accepted by the Court, you still have a right to appeal your conviction to a higher court. The appeal for a guilty plea is limited, however, to four (4) grounds. They are: (1) that your guilty plea was not knowing, intelligent and voluntary; (2) that the attorney representing you and advising you to enter a plea of guilty did not properly do so; (3) that the Court did not have jurisdiction to accept your plea (in other words, the crime(s) for which you are pleading guilty did not occur in Beaver County); and (4) that the Court's sentence is unlawful. Do you understand these four (4) reasons you could appeal and what they mean? _____

24. In order to appeal your conviction of a plea of guilty, you should, within **ten (10) days** from the date you are sentenced, file a written motion to withdraw your guilty plea. You must file a Notice of Appeal to the Superior Court within thirty (30) days after your sentence or after your motion to withdraw your guilty plea is denied, whichever is later. If you cannot afford an attorney to represent you and/or you are contending that the attorney who represented you at your guilty plea was incompetent, you have the right to have another attorney appointed for you to raise those four (4) reasons or claims. If you do not file your Notice of Appeal within thirty (30) days of your sentence or denial of your motion to withdraw your guilty plea, you give up your right ever to complain again of any of those four (4) reasons or claims, including incompetent counsel. Do you understand the meaning of the various appeal rights that have just been explained to you? _____
25. Are you aware of the maximum sentence and/or fine that can be imposed for the offense(s) to which you are pleading? _____
26. Are you aware of any mandatory minimum sentence and/or fine that can be imposed for the offense(s) to which you are pleading? _____
27. Are you aware that if you are pleading guilty to and will be sentenced on more than one offense or count, the sentences imposed can be run consecutively, that is, one after the other? _____
28. Are you aware that the total cumulative maximum sentence and fine that can be imposed is the total of each of the individual offenses for which you are being sentenced? _____
29. Do you understand the nature of the charge(s) to which you are pleading guilty? _____
30. Has your attorney explained to you the elements of the criminal offense(s) to which you are pleading guilty? _____
31. Do you admit to committing the crime(s) and to the legal elements explained to you which make up that crime(s) to which you are pleading guilty? _____
32. Has anybody forced you to enter this guilty plea and/or plea agreement? _____
33. Are you doing this of your own free will? _____
34. Have any threats been made to you to enter a plea of guilty? _____
35. Have any promises been made to you to enter a plea of guilty other than any plea agreement that has been negotiated for you by yourself and/or your attorney? _____
36. Do you understand that when you plead guilty and the plea is accepted by the Court, all that remains is for the Court to sentence you on the charge(s) to which you have plead guilty? _____

38. Do you understand that if you change your mind about your plea of guilty, you have to ask the Court for permission to withdraw your plea? _____
39. Do you further understand that you can make a request to withdraw your plea any time after today, but no later than ten (10) days after you are sentenced? _____

40. You have a right to have witnesses present at a sentence hearing to testify against you. Are you willing to give up that right and have the attorney for the Commonwealth summarize their case against you? _____
41. Are you willing to give up your right to a pre-sentence investigation report and agree to be sentenced immediately after you enter your plea? _____
42. Are you now on probation or parole? _____
- (a) If you are on probation or parole, do you realize that your plea of guilty will mean a violation of that probation or parole and that you can be sentenced to prison as a result of that violation caused by your guilty plea today? _____
43. Have you had ample opportunity to consult with your attorney before deciding that you would enter your plea of guilty? _____
44. Are you satisfied with the representation of your attorney? _____
45. Do you understand that the decision to enter a plea of guilty is yours and yours alone, and that no one can force you to enter a guilty plea? _____
46. Do you understand that you do not have to enter a plea of guilty and give up your rights as previously explained to you in this document? _____
47. Has your attorney, or some other member of his/her staff, gone over the meaning of the terms of this document with you? (If you are represented by the Public Defender's Office, do not answer this question until someone from the Public Defender's Office goes over it with you.) _____

If your sentence orders supervision by the Beaver County Adult Probation Department you will be required to comply with the conditions of probation set forth in 42 Pa.C.S. §9763 and the following Rules:

1. You will be under the supervision of the Adult Probation and Parole Department and will report regularly in person, by telephone, e-mail, or in writing to your Probation Officer according to his/her instructions. Field visits may be conducted by the Probation Office staff. DO NOT contact any Probation Officer at his/her residence.
2. You are to abide by any verbal and written instructions of this Department and/or your Probation Officer. You will respond promptly to any communication from the Probation Department.
3. You must obtain permission from your Probation Officer prior to changing your residence, address or phone number. You must notify the Clerk of Courts of any such changes. No Pennsylvania resident shall move to another State before receiving permission from his/her supervising Probation Officer or prior to receiving approval and reporting instructions from the receiving State. A \$100 application fee is required when attempting to relocate to another State.
4. You will not travel outside of Pennsylvania without a written travel permit. Travel permits are required for work/employment outside of Pennsylvania. Travel permits are good for up to a maximum of 30 days from the date of issuance and must be renewed upon expiration
5. You will comply with all Municipal, County, State and Federal Criminal Laws, as well as the provisions in the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code and Pennsylvania Liquor Code. You MUST notify your Probation Officer within 72

hours of any arrest, receipt of summons, citation or investigation by law enforcement agencies and/or your participation with any law enforcement agency as a confidential informant.

6. You will make every effort to obtain and maintain employment and to support your dependents. You MUST notify your Probation Officer within 72 hrs. of any change or loss of employment. You will engage in an active job search, pursue a prescribed secular course of study or vocational training during periods of unemployment and provide verification of these efforts as directed by your Probation Officer. If you are unemployed and employable, you will actively participate in the Adult Probation/Career Link Program.

7. You will abstain from the unlawful possession, use, or sale of illicit drugs and from the abuse of prescription drugs. You will submit to any recognized tests, that are available, to determine whether or not you have been using drugs and/or alcohol.

8. If your sentence is a result of a DUI offense or if the crime for which you were placed on supervision involved the use of alcohol, you will abstain from the use of alcoholic beverages. All offenders placed on supervision shall refrain from the excessive use of alcoholic beverages and are strictly prohibited from frequenting any establishment whose primary business is the sale of alcohol, unless otherwise permitted by the Court and/or your Probation Officer.

9. You shall refrain from purchasing any firearms, deadly or offensive weapons. You will not possess any firearms, deadly or offensive weapons, which includes any explosive devices. All firearms and/or lethal weapons, in your residence and/or vehicle, must be removed within 72 hrs. of imposition of sentence. HUNTING IS PROHIBITED.

10. You will refrain from any assaultive behavior and/or actions which threaten or present a clear and present danger to yourself and/or others.

11. You will pay all fines, costs, fees, restitution and treatment costs prior to the expiration of your sentence.

I acknowledge that I have read the foregoing document in its entirety, and I understand its full meaning and that my answers to the questions are truthful. I also affirm that I am still, nevertheless, willing to enter a plea of guilty to the offense(s) specified. I further affirm that my signature and my initials on this document are true and correct and that I have signed the same in the presence of my attorney.
